How do I become a member of the Pats Peak Ski Team?

Step 1

Fill out the Pats Peak Ski Team Application. If you did not get one in the mail you can download a copy from the web site www.patspeakracing.org, Application is due prior to 12/29/08, sign up pay dues prior to 11/02/08 and save \$50 per racer. Also please make sure you fill out the medical release form and send it in with the application. Please mail completed applications to Susan Hughes, 3 Ogden Dr, Bow NH 03304

Step 2

Fill out the Pats Peak Season Pass application. You can do this online at www.patspeak.com, stop into the office at Pats Peak or fill out paper application from their site and mail it in. Early sign up discounts exist please check out the Pats Peak application early.

Step 3

Fill out the NHARA application. Each racer need to be a member of NHARA in order to participate in races. You can find their application at www.nhalpine.org

Step 4

Fill out the USSA application. Every racer needs to be a member of USSA. Proof of membership is required to register at each competition. Alpine official memberships are required for certain volunteer positions at our races. We encourage parents with an interest in race leadership to sign up. Background checks are required by USSA and this can take up to 6 weeks. Application can be found at www.ussa.org

The **Pats Peak Ski Club** is a not-for-profit organization run by the parents of the racers, in cooperation with Pats Peak Ski Area in Henniker, New Hampshire. The Club has operated for over thirty-six years and has produced numerous college and professional racers and, more importantly, countless positive experiences for the kids and their families.

TRAINING:

The Club provides on snow training each Saturday and Sunday, as well as Christmas and February school vacation periods, from mid December through March. Training is also available mid-week, on Tues, Wed, and Thurs evenings in January and February.

COACHING:

The Ski Club is proud to host a seasoned coaching staff that not only has produced quality athletes, but has helped inspire lifelong friendships and love for the sport. Your athlete will meet with their assigned coach each day at the ATC (Alpine Training Center). We ski from 9:00 until approximately 2:30 each training day.

RACES:

The age group (and race level, for older athletes) your skier competes in (i.e.: JIV, JV) determines where you'll be racing on any given weekend. In general, you can expect your athlete to race in a minimum of 6 races over a ski season. Most races are held in Southern New Hampshire, including Pats Peak. You are responsible for getting your athlete to ski races. A full race schedule will be provided to you in our handbook or is available at www.patspeakracing.org.
